Feral Cat Surgeries

A Feral is a cat/kitten that can not be touched or handled. •Cats/kittens must be feral to be accepted for surgery without an appt. •Check-in is between 8:30 & 9:30 a.m. **on a first come, first served basis.**

•Due to limited resources, there is no guarantee we will be able to accept feral cats/kittens for surgery despite our best efforts.

•Feral cats/kittens must be contained in a trap for their safety (not a carrier).

Only one cat/kitten per humane trap.

It is recommended to perform a FELV/Fiv/HWT test on all feral cats/kittens. It is mandatory if you are requesting the leukemia vaccine.

•A Rabies vaccine is recommended.

•Ears will be notched or tipped to identify cat/kitten as feral. This serves as an indicator that the animal has been spayed/neutered.

•Please set your trap at night and if your trap is empty in the early morning, trigger the trap and reset again at night.

•Do NOT trap over the weekends or holidays.

•Trapping any animal should only be done in accordance with California State Laws. Please check with your local animal control agency first.

•When trapping you will be responsible for the humane & legal care of that animal.

•Never trap an animal and relocate to another location.
