

Humane Officers Rescue Owl



This past month a family in the north end of San Bernardino called us regarding an owl stuck in their chimney. The family was very concerned as the owl had been stuck for several days and they were unable to get help from other organizations.

Our Humane Officers responded, and found a rather feisty young owl indeed stuck down the chimney. The rescue proved to be challenging, as our Officers had to fashion their own tools for removing the stuck raptor. Thankfully, they were able to pull him unharmed down through the fire place. The owl was very upset and grouchy, the result of not having eaten for a few days. The family suspected he had fallen down the chimney three days prior, while learning to fly.



After an examination by our veterinarian, the officers transported the owl to a licensed rehabber for care. After four days of rehabbing and getting back to a healthy weight, our officers were able to pick up the young owl for release back into his neighborhood. The owl was brought back to the

place of his accident and turned loose in the family's back yard. This way, if he wasn't quite ready to fly on his own his parents would still drop him food once they heard him and knew he was back home. The good news is that he hopped around for a minute or two, then flew onto a wrought iron gate to give the family an owlish look, before he flew off on his own.

Not every story like this will have a happy ending, but this one did thanks to a caring and persistent family who values and appreciates the wildlife they share their neighborhood with. If they hadn't stuck with trying to get this guy help, he would have surely died.



Officer Ashbaker, who released the owl, said, "Watching this owl fly off into the evening sky with the family was priceless."

This family was indeed a voice for those that didn't have one!

From the Vet's Desk: Spring Time

Summer is a time for vacations, cookouts and pool parties. However, when the temperature heats up, the danger to pets increases too. Here are some things to think about for keeping your pet safe and healthy in the summer:

Parasites

With all the time your pet will be spending outdoors, one of the biggest dangers is ticks. You should check your pet for ticks at least once a day, as well as look closely after walks or hikes through wooded areas. Ticks carry a number of diseases that can be transferred to you and your family including Lyme disease. Fleas also can spread diseases (such as typhus or the plague) to you and your pet, but symptoms are often hard to spot. Dogs may be tired or feverish or become lame. So talk to your vet about effective flea and tick medication.

Swimming

Despite what YouTube may tell us, cats and rabbits don't like to swim. Putting your pet in the pool can also be dangerous, as not all dogs have mastered the doggie paddle. Some may not like water, and certain breeds like pugs and terriers, may have trouble swimming. Never ever force your dog into the water. If you luck out, and your pet enjoys splashing around, always rinse off after a swim. The chlorine, salt and bacteria in pools and lakes can be harmful. Animals should also have a shady area nearby where they can cool off and have access to fresh water, as drinking salt water and pool water can cause health problems.

Feeling Hot! Hot! Hot!

Ever heard the expression, "It's so hot, you can fry an egg on the sidewalk?" Things like black pavement (or asphalt) can get very hot and can harm your pets' paws, causing painful burns.

Think about what you're walking on. If you wouldn't like walking on it with bare feet, try to limit your dog's time on it, too.

An important reminder- NEVER EVER LEAVE YOUR DOG IN THE CAR!!!!!

SBPD K-9 Units Honored by HSSBV

The HSSBV Walk for the Animals presented by San Manuel Band of Mission Indians was hosted at San Manuel Stadium on Saturday, May 11th. There was walking, prizes, food and fun. Over \$16,000 was raised in support of our pograms and services! A highlight of the event was the presentation of the 2019 HSSBV Pet Hero Award to the San Bernardino Police Department (SBPD) K-9 Unit teams.

The SBPD K-9 Unit was founded in 1979, and is comprised of five k-9 teams: Officer Sergio Alvarez with Canine Rambo; Officer Melissa Flint with Canine Bexter; Officer Christopher Emon with Canine Sarko, Corporal Jonathan Keil with Canine Rico; and Detective Jesus Vega with Maxwell.

Handler Corporal Jonathan Keil and Canine Rico

Corporal Keil joined the San Bernardino Police Department in 2009. He has worked a variety of assignments to include: Field Training Officer, SWAT Team, and Mounted Enforcement Detail. Prior to applying with the agency, he was an SBPD Police Explorer for 7 years. Corporal Keil was assigned to the K-9 Unit in 2013, when he selected his partner, K-9 Rico.

Corporal Keil and Canine Rico are assigned to the south east patrol district. Rico is a seven year old Dutch Malinois, who was born in Holland. Rico is a triple purpose K-9 certified in patrol operations, narcotics detection and SWAT tactics. In Rico's 5 ½ years, he has been present in several high risk incidents, including the terrorist attack on December 2, 2015. K-9 Rico has successfully apprehended 20 violent criminals, had nearly 90 surrenders, completed 600 patrol searches and located an excess of 1.6 million dollars worth of illegal narcotics.



Handler Officer Melissa Flint and Canine Bexter

Officer Flint joined the San Bernardino Police Department in 2004. She has worked a variety of assignments to include: Community Inter-Agency Training and Enforcement Team, Crime Impact Team, District Resource Officer, Field Training Officer, Taser and Defensive Tactics Instructor, and is a member of the Honor Guard Detail. Officer Flint's career goal was to become a K-9 handler. She was assigned to the K-9 unit in 2016, when she selected her partner, Canine Bexter.

Officer Flint and Canine Bexter are assigned to the south west patrol district. Bexter is a three year old Dutch Malinois, who was born in Holland. Bexter is a dual purpose K-9, certified in both patrol operations and narcotics detection. In Bexter's 2 years, he has located 9 suspects, had 14 surrenders and 3 apprehensions. Bexter has conducted approximately 150 narcotic searches, locating over \$400,000.00 worth of narcotics. Bexter's biggest find was 6 kilograms of Cocaine located inside a hidden engine compartment and 31 pounds of Methamphetamine located inside a vehicle trunk void. Bexter loves participating in community events and even more, he loves working the city, keeping its citizens safe.

Handler Officer Sergio Alvarez and Canine Rambo

Officer Alvarez joined the San Bernardino Police Department in 2016. He has worked assignments in patrol to include the south west district, north east district and north west district. Officer Alvarez is also a certified Spanish interpreter for the City of San Bernardino. He enjoys participating in community events and serving the City of San Bernardino. He was assigned to the K-9 Unit in 2018, when he selected his partner, Canine Rambo. Officer Alvarez and Canine Rambo are assigned to the south west patrol district. Rambo is a two year old, Dutch Malinois, who was born in Holland. Rambo is a dual purpose dog who is certified in patrol operations and explosives detection. In his off time, he enjoys spending time with the Alvarez Family.

Prior to joining the ranks of the San Bernardino Police Department, Officer Alvarez proudly served his country in the United States Marine Corps, acquiring the rank of Corporal.

Handler Officer Christopher Emon and Canine Sarko

Officer Emon joined the San Bernardino Police Department in 2003. He was assigned to the Field Training Program, where he trained several sworn and non-sworn employees. He also augments the Management Information Services and assists with streamlining report writing protocols. Officer Emon was assigned to the K-9 Unit in 2013, when he selected his partner, Canine Sarko.

Officer Emon and Canine Sarko are assigned to the north east patrol district. Sarko is a seven year old Belgian Malinois, who was born in Belgium. Sarko is a dual purpose K-9 certified in patrol operations and narcotics detection. In Sarko's 5 ½ years, he has been deployed over 450 times, locating 90 suspects, recovered 25 articles of evidence, responded to 1000 burglary alarms, found over a million dollars in narcotics, and trained over 2000 hours.

Handler Detective Jesus Vega and Canine Maxwell

Detective Vega joined the San Bernardino Police Department in 2004. He has worked a variety of assignments to include: Field Training Officer, Crime Impact Team, Vice/Narcotics Program, Specialized Enforcement Team, and a member of the Honor Guard Detail. Prior to applying with the agency, he was an SBPD Police Explorer for 4 years. In 2008 while assigned to the Vice/Narcotics Program, Detective Vega was assigned his first canine partner, Dexter. Dexter was a single purpose canine who was certified in narcotics detection. Dexter was retired as a police canine in January 2014. Detective Vega and was assigned to the K-9 Unit in 2015, where he selected his partner, Canine Maxwell. Maxwell is a 6 ½ year old chocolate Labrador Retriever. Maxwell is certified in the detection of Cocaine, Heroin, Marijuana, and Methamphetamine.

Prior to joining the ranks of the San Bernardino Police Department, Detective Vega proudly served his country in the United States Marine Corps, acquiring the rank of First Sergeant.

Also joining us at the Walk for the Animals, were the SBPD Explorers! The Explorers helped set up the event, assisted with various activities during the event to help it run smoothly, and coordinated cleanup efforts after the event. The HSSBV staff, volunteers and our event vendors were extremely appreciative of their hard work, dedication and overall helpfulness.
