From the Vet's Desk: Dental Care

Your pet has teeth that need care, just like ours!

Dental disease is the number one health problem diagnosed by veterinarians. Bad breath is usually the first thing owners notice and is often the first indicator of dental disease.

By three years old, 80% of dogs and 70% of cats have gum disease. When tartar starts to build up then bacteria hides under it. Every time your pet chews on a toy or food, they spread this bacteria through their blood stream. This can cause problems with the heart, liver, kidneys and other organs.

Your pet needs annual dental check-ups and regular brushing to stay healthy and free of dental disease. If you have never brushed your pet's teeth here are a few steps to help keep their gums and teeth healthy:

1. Always use pet toothpaste. "People" tooth paste contains fluoride which can be harmful.

2. Use a soft toothbrush or a tooth brush made for pets. They are angled to help you do a good job. If you have never brushed their teeth before you may want to start with a finger brush. Avoid forcing them or reprimanding them. Try to make it a fun experience that your pet will enjoy.

3. Keep the sessions short. Just brushing for 1 minute a day can make a world of difference to your pet's health. Remember to make your pet's dental health a priority. It will allow them to live a longer healthier life.

Humane Officers A "Fishy" Situation

With the recent news and social media attention focused on people selling sick and underage puppies, we thought now would be a good time to shine a light on other animals that are often sold under rather unscrupulous and inhumane conditions. There are currently numerous laws in the State of California that regulate animals and their care at swap meets, pet stores, and also dictate the size of turtles that can be offered for sale. There is also a risk of diseases spread by contact with those turtles. Far too many times people encounter betta fish and baby slider turtles being sold in small pet shops and swap meets, to convenience stores and markets. Sadly, these laws and dangers are for the most part unknown by the public and vendors. These laws are in place to ensure the protection of both the animals and the public.

Recently our officers were asked to check on two betta fish and a small slider turtle being offered for sale at a small market in Highland. Our officers found the animals in small containers with very dirty water. These animals were sitting by the cash register next to food items also offered for sale. Do you see possible health code violations here?

Yes, bettas and turtles can live in shallow water, but both species are rather dirty when it comes to waste and need water changes frequently to ensure their health and well-being. Many experts recommend at least a 2 gallon aquarium for one betta to live and thrive, not a small plastic dish. Water turtles will also need some kind of log or platform to get out of the water and bask. These three guys were all kept in separate plastic dishes with filthy shallow water. One betta was in such dirty water you couldn't tell there was a fish in the container. The turtle had no perch to bask, he just floated in his container. All three animals appeared very lethargic and sickly. Our officers seized the three and brought them to the HSSBV right away.

The first order of business was getting them in adequate enclosures with proper water conditions and temperatures. The two bettas instantly responded to the warmer water temperatures they were given (the water they were in was too cold and probably tap water that can slowly kill a betta). The turtle was given a basking perch and was able to finally get out of the water and warm up. To date, the turtle was released to a turtle rescue and the two bettas were adopted and are living the good life in a nice aquarium set up.



All too often, animals like these three are viewed as disposable. Remember, no animal is disposable, all are worthy of humane treatment and are protected under California State Law. Thanks to a caring person, there are three less animals that will end up dying a slow death and getting flushed down the toilet or thrown in the trash.

Kenai's Corner- The Importance of Play!



Happy New Year everyone. Kenai, here! I am so excited for a new year and to learn new things. I received some cool new toys for Christmas and can't wait for Mom and I to go out and play.

Having fun is a natural behavior for dogs. Puppies do it without any training. For some reason, Mom sees a lot of dogs that either don't know how to play or they are frightened of your attempts to get them to play.

Dogs need to play for their mental and physical health. Playing with your dog will strengthen and build a solid bond. One of the reasons dogs are man's best friend is because they share our love of playing.

Whenever we encounter a dog with behavior problems, our first question is how much exercise does he get? Lack of exercise can cause any number of behavior problems. Dogs that get into things they shouldn't, tear up your belongings, or try to escape their home are normally lacking in positive exercise. Keep in mind that a tired dog is a well-behaved dog.

Playing with your dog and encouraging other family members to play with them will result in a well socialized dog. Allowing your young dog to play with other dogs also results in good socialization. However, supervise your dog and keep his play time positive.

Unfortunately, some dogs never have an opportunity to play with humans. They may be puppy mill dogs, dogs banished to the backyard, or rescues that have been kept in a kennel. Before attempting to teach your play deprived dog to play ensure he trusts you. To begin to teach your dog to play, grab one of his toys and toss it around gently, smile and laugh a lot, then put the toy away out of reach but where he can see it. Do this several times and then leave the toy where your dog can check it out. If he approaches or picks up the toy offer him some treats. Never shove a toy at him. If he begins to play offer treats and encourage him. Using toys that allow treats to dispense during play are a great training tool. While training your dog to play, take it slow and never correct or punish him. Spend time each day playing and you will see how rewarding it will be for you and your dog.

Sometimes, humans get so wrapped up in their daily lives they forget about the importance of having fun. So when your dog drops that ball in your lap, lowers the front of his body and the tail is in the air wagging: Stop, take a break and go out and play with your dog.
