A Look Back at 50 Years of Helping Animals-Guest Writer, Marilyn Sauer

What better way to remember the Humane Society of San Bernardino Valley's deep 50 year history, than hearing from those who were there? In this issue we hear from HSSBV donor, volunteer and longtime supporter, Marilyn Sauer. Written by Jill A. Henderson, Director of Development & Outreach for the HSSBV

"Joyce Martin and I, we were friends forever," Marilyn Sauer fondly remembers. "We met through the school district and both loved animals. We even used to ride horses together."

Marilyn was friends with Joyce for so long, she doesn't even remember the day or how exactly they met. But they became fast friends, bonding over their love of animals. Marilyn describes Joyce's passion for animals as having been her number one priority, saying her whole life was about animals.

When Joyce founded the HSSBV's first home on Highland Avenue, Marilyn worked at Arrowview Elementary School not too far away. Along with Joyce and other dedicated volunteers, they would walk from business to business asking for support to raise funds for the "new" HSSBV facility (our current home on Orange Show Road). "We passed out brochures, shared information about donating for tiles and bricks at the new facility. The business owners were receptive and supportive," she says.

Joyce's top priorities included the children and humane education. She was determined to hire a Humane Education Teacher. Having worked both for the school district and in schools, she understood how important this would be. Marilyn thinks Joyce would be particularly proud of this program if she were here today.

"Joyce saw a city our size, in the largest county in the United States, really lacked proper organizations for animals at that time. I never met anyone as unique as her. No one worked harder, and no one cared more about animals. Without Joyce, there would not be a Humane Society."

Cruelty Investigation Department: We Are All In This Together

So far 2020 has been a rather memorable year thanks to the global pandemic COVID 19. We as a world find ourselves facing strange, uncertain times and our leaders are telling us the road to recovery will potentially be long and slow. We at the HSSBV want you to know that we are all in this together and we all can help each other (human and animal) if we take a deep breath and use our common sense. It is true that many public animal welfare agencies, rescues and veterinary facilities are having trouble meeting the demands of the public's requests for service. In time, things will eventually get back to normal, but until then we will try to help out and give advice regarding animal related problems/concerns you may be having.

Many public animal care/controls have scaled back their services to protect the public as well as their employees and we understand this. Our officers are still investigating complaints of animal cruelty and neglect but must work within the health guidelines set forth by the State of California. We will respect the temporary safety measures set forth by other local agencies we work with. If a situation dictates an immediate response from our officers, they will respond and handle the situation in accordance with State Law, including the possible seizure/care of an animal in need and the filing of a cruelty case when appropriate. It is very important that everyone stays safe, patient, and understanding.

Donations Are Needed In Aftermath of Pandemic

Update: USDA to Regulate Birds After 16 Year Delay

As a result of a lawsuit brought by the American Anti-Vivisection Society (AAVS) and the Avian Welfare Coalition (AWC), the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is now subject to a court order to complete rulemaking to protect birds nationwide, as required by the Animal Welfare Act (AWA).

The order will provide judicial oversight of USDA's stated "intention to promulgate regulations required by the AWA for birds not bred for use in research." The order was jointly submitted to the court by AAVS, AWC, and USDA. Birds who will be protected by these regulations are those exploited in certain commercial industries, including for exhibition, breeding, and the pet trade.

HSSBV Remains Open during Pandemic; Begins to Return to All Normal Services

As you know, the HSSBV has remained open during the pandemic with a limited amount of our services in order to treat critical pets. We are excited to announce that effective immediately, we will be offering all of our normal services, including spay and neuter! In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, you will notice some changes to the check in process in our clinic. We appreciate your co-operation and understanding. These modifications have been made for the safety of our clients, as well as our staff.

Please call 909-386-1400 to schedule an appointment for spay, neuter, dental consultation, vet exam, vaccines, etc. Please keep in mind, our phone call volume is extremely high at this time and hold times will be longer than usual. Additionally, if you choose to leave a voicemail rather than wait on hold, return phone calls may take longer than normal.

We DO NOT schedule appointments or diagnose pets via facebook, Instagram, Twitter, email or Yelp. Please use social media only for general organizational questions.

We do offer a LIMITED AMOUNT of walk-ins for vet exams each day. These are on a first come, first serve basis. However, we STRONGLY encourage you to make an appointment. The HSSBV is open Monday – Friday. At this time, our regular "Saturday Shot Clinic" is not open.

We are not able to provide spay/neuter surgery without an appointment. Thank you to all of our amazing clients, donors, volunteers and supporters who have gone out of their way to show us kindness and support the past few months!

As a reminder, this time is stressful for everyone, including our staff. We appreciate our clients showing our staff kindness and compassion. Verbally abusing the staff will not be tolerated under any circumstances.
